2017 Summary

A summary of our eventful year.

- Jan FODV committee kick started the year with a planning meeting to ascertain where our energy was to be focused for the year.
- May FODV participated in the Australian Heritage Festival titled Milltown Days – Women at the Donnelly 1948 – 1978. With an audience of approximately 35 visitors facilitated by Sally Paulin (FODV Committee member) to hear stories and yarns from Mrs Grace O'Neill, daughter Carole Steele, and friends from childhood; Jacquie Perry (nee Morfitt) and Margaret Jenaway (nee Kililea).
- Aug FODV Historical Signage Project Facilitated by Tony and Sally Paulin initial concept prepared and presented to the Wheatley Board for approval to create and have installed a heritage signage trail around the townsite of Wheatley.
- **Sept** Official Opening of the FODV Museum located in a classroom at the Donnelly River School, Carey Road Donnelly River.

Another successful event with attendance of approximately 130 people comprising personnel from the Shires of Nannup, Bridgetown and Manjimup, State and Local politicians, local residents, Wheatley Owners and Management as well as past residents & workers of the mill and village. We were also honoured to have Mrs Jenny Mills (daughter of Charles Bunning) and her family attend with Jenny delivering an Opening Speech as well as unveiling the plaque. A huge thank you to Michael & Cindy Spight for creating the museum and to committee for facilitating the event.







1. Mill with Stack
