

Welcome to the Trail

The Donnelly River Heritage Trail connects thirteen historical markers dotted around the township.

The markers help bring to life the rich history of the Bunnings Donnelly Mill settlement, highlighting events, people and intriguing aspects of daily life.

The trail is a project of the Friends of Donnelly Village Inc., along with village owners Wheatley Village Pty Ltd and Lotterywest.

The Village

Donnelly River Village is a heritage-listed mill town amidst the karri forests. It became a holiday destination after the mill closed in 1978, and it still provides holiday accommodation.

The village has a general store and café, a heritage playground, a swimming dam, a flying fox and gas barbecue facilities – not to mention native animals roaming free.

The Donnelly Mill is the only remaining sawdustpowered, steam-driven sawmill in Western Australia. Learn more at <u>www.savedonnellymill2018.org.au</u>

Featuring many images and artifacts and a wealth of interpretive information, it's well worth a visit.




