Mosaic Data Collection System

As we have such a vast amount of information, photos and artefacts, we want to make sure they are recorded correctly. Save Donnelly Mill 2018 inc.

FODV is a member of SDM2018 Inc and can report that the Department of Planning Lands and Heritage has undertaken some investigations into how best to preserve the site – including a heritage inspection, some work done to divert water away from the building, carefully dismantling the sawdust conveyor near the furnace for safety purposes and adding extra wire to the fences to secure the site. SDM2018 keeps in close touch with the DoPLH and has also arranged a destination tourism management project by Murdoch University tourism management students to advise on possible options for the future of the Mill as a regional tourism site/trails centre etc.
